2.15	Stream, 10 lks. wide, course N.
	Ascend.
15.30	Top of a ridge, course N. about 300 ft. above stream. Descend.
25.00	A dry creek bed, 15 lks. wide, course NE. about 325 ft. below top of last ridge, Ascend.
