CHAINS

Soil, 3rd & 4th rate.

Heavily timbered with fir, alder and maple.

Dense undergrowth of thimbleberry, sallal, vine maple & briars.

August 1, 1894.

I run

West, on a true line on N. bdy. of sec. 16.

Var. 20°E.

Descend.

6.00 Bottom of a gulch, course S. about 250 ft. below cor.

Ascend.

21.00 Top of a ridge, course N. & S. about 400 ft. above gulch.

Descend.

31.75 Bottom of a gulch, course N. about 400 ft. below top of last ridge.

Ascend.

39.00 Top of a spur, course N. about 250 ft. above last gulch.

Descend.

40.00 Set a post, 3 ft. long and 3 ins. sq. for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. on N. face, from which

A cherry, 3 ins. diam., bears N.33°E. 12 lks. dist. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.

A willow, 4 ins. diam., bears S.52°W. 50 lks. dist. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.

45.00 Bottom of a gulch, course N. about 150 ft. below last spur.

Ascend.

48.00 Top of a spur, course N. about 100 ft. above last gulch.

50.60 A stream, 2 lks. wide, course N. about 150 ft. below last spur.

Ascend.
