## Subdivisions of T. 22 S., R. 11 W.

CHAINS

54.25 Top of a spur, course N. about 150 ft. above last stream.  
Descend.

66.25 Stream, 2 lks. wide, course N.  
Ascend.

75.00 Top of a ridge, course N. & S. about 400 ft. above last  
stream.  
Descend.

80.00 Set a stone 10x8x7 ins., 7 ins. in ground for cor. to  
secs. 16 & 17, marked with 4 notches on S. and E.  
edges, from which

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.21°E. 25 lks. dist.  
marked T 22 S R 11 W S 16 B T.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.52°W. 6 lks. dist.  
marked T 22 S R 11 W S 17 B T.

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.54°W. 11 lks. dist.  
marked T 22 S R 11 W S 16 & 17 B T.

Land, 80.00 chs. mountainous.

Soil, 3rd & 4th rate.

Heavily timbered with fir and alder.

Very dense undergrowth of thimbleberry, sallal, huckle-  
berry, salmonberry & briars, 80.00 chs.

Aug. 2, 1894.

I then begin at the cor. to secs. 3, 4, 9 & 10, which is  
a stone 12x10x7 ins., above ground with 5 notches on S.  
and 3 notches on E. edges, The original bearing trees  
being gone I marked new ones as follows:

A willow, 4 ins. diam., bears N.74°E. 10 lks. dist.  
marked T 22 S R 11 W S 3 B T.

An alder, 3 ins. diam., bears S.31°W. 50 lks. dist.  
marked T 22 S R 11 W S 9 B T.

A willow, 5 ins. diam., bears N.11°W. 8 lks. dist.  
marked T 22 S R 11 W S 4 B T.
