	Descend.
38.50	Bottom of a gulch, course S. about 150 ft. below last spur.
39.75	Set a post 3 ft. long and 3 ins. sq., 2 ft. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on N. face, from which A fir, 4 ins. diam., bears N.11*W. 39 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. An alder, 5 ins. diam., bears S.23*W. 78 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
44.00	Top of a spur, course S. about 200 ft. above last gulch. Descend.
55.75	A dry creek bed, 10 lks. wide, course S. about 475 ft. below top of last spur. Ascend.
67.00	Top of a spur, course S.10*W. about 450 ft. above last dry creek. Descend.
74.00	Bottom of a gulch, course S. about 275 ft. below last spur. And ascend.
79.50	The cor. to secs. 20, 21, 28 & 29. Land, mountainous, 79.50 chs. Soil, 3rd & 4th rate. Heavily timbered with fir, cedar and alder--young growth. Very dense undergrowth of thimbleberry, sallal, huckleberry & briars. Aug. 7, 1894.

18.50	Descend through timber. Schofield Creek, 25 lks. wide, course W. about 450 ft. below cor. And ascend.
21.00	Top of a spur, course NW. Descend.
