Intersect N. & S. line 6.00 chs. S. of cor. to secs. 28, 29, 32 & 33 at which point I set a stone 12x10x5 ins., 8 ins. in the ground for closing cor. to secs. 29 & 32, marked C. C. with 1 notch on S. and 4 notches on E. edges, from which

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.9*W. 277 lks. dist.
marked T 22 S R 11 W S 29 B T.

An alder, 3 ins. diam., bears S.26*E. 35 lks. dist.
marked T 22 S R 11 W C C S. 29 & 32 B T.

No other trees in limits.

Pits impracticable.

Land, 86.97 chs. mountainous.

Soil, 3rd & 4th rate.

Heavily timbered with young growth of fir and alder.

Dense undergrowth of thimbleberry and briars, 86.97 chs.
