	Beginning at the cor. to secs. 2, 3, 10 & 11.
	I run
	N.0°39'E. bet. secs. 2 & 3.
40.00	At this point I make diligent search for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. which is described as being a stone 18x10x6 ins. but am unable to find any trace of it.
73.00	From this point the meander cor. to fractional secs. 2 & 3 bears S.89°21' E. 51 lks. dist.
	Thence I run
	S.1°3'W. on a true line bet. secs. 2 & 3.
	Over marsh, through timber.
1.15	Leave marsh and ascend.
14.50	Top of a spur, course N.75°E. about 500 ft. high.
	And descend.
19.40	Bottom of a gulch, course NE. about 200 ft. below top of last ridge.
	And ascend.
25.45	Top of a spur, course NE. about 250 ft. above last gulch.
33.00	Set a sandstone, 18x14x6 ins., 11 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. side.
	A maple, 4 ins. diam., bears N.63°W. 10 lks. dist.
	which I mark $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
	An alder, 3 ins. diam., bears N.82°E. 27 lks. dist.
	which I mark $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
53.00	Top of ridge, course E. & W.
	And descend.
73.00	The cor. to secs. 2, 3, 10 & 11.
	Land, mountainous, 71.85 chs.
	Soil, 4th rate--rocky.
	N.1.15 chs. marsh; soil 1st rate.
	Heavily timbered with fir, alder, spruce, and wild cherry.
	Dense undergrowth of thimbleberry, sallal and huckleberry, 73.00 chs.
