40.00	Set $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. post from which A Cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears N.58*E., 9 lks. dist. A Fir, 60 ins. diam., bears S.65*W., 25 lks. dist.
46.20	Mountain too steep to continue on line. S.60*E 1.60 South 3.05 S.60*W 1.60
50.85	Ridge course E&W
61.50	Stream 4 lks. wide course E.
76.25	Stream 2 lks. wide course SE.
79.97	Stream 3 lks. wide course NE.
80.00	Set post corner of Secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15, from which A Maple, 24 ins. diam., bears N.85*E., 87 lks. dist. A Cedar, 36 ins. diam., bears S.65*E., 150 lks. dist. To the West too steep and rocky to make other bearing trees. Raised monument of stone. Land, mountainous. Soil, 3rd rate. Timber, same as last mile.
	East, on Random between Secs. 11 and 14. Va. 19*15'E.
40.00	Set temporary $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. post
80.92	Intersect N.60 lks. from Sec. corner. N.89*34'W On true line between Secs. 11 and 14.
3.00	Ridge course S.
19.50	Enter Bottom.
25.00	To Schofield River at about the head of Tide water. Width 40 lks. Depth 2 ft.
35.00	Leave Bottom.
40.46	Set $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. post from which A Spruce, 18 ins. diam., bears S.27*E., 54 lks. dist. A Fir, 50 ins. diam., bears N. 3*E., 47 lks. dist.
51.00	Stream 2 lks. wide course NE.
