

MEANDERS, T. 22 S., R. 12 W., W.M.

CHAINS

It is all heavily timbered with Spruce, Fir, Cedar, Hemlock and Alder, and a dense undergrowth of Salal, Salmonberry, Whortleberry, Vine-Maple and Crabapple. The only settlement is at Winchester Bay. The southern portion of the township is mountainous and unfit for settlement or cultivation.

Subdivisions of T. 22 S., R. 12 W. W.M. as surveyed by W. H. Byars, Deputy Surveyor, under Contract No. 202, dated March 11, 1874.

Begin at the established corner to Secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15; and run South on true line between Secs. 14 and 15.
