CHAINS

S 35 T 22 S on NE S 2 R 12 W on SE S 3 T 23 S on SW S 34 on NW faces, with 2 notches on E and 4 notches on W edges, from which

Stump of Alder, 12 ins. diam., bears N.32°E,  
302 lks. dist., marked B T.

Stump of Alder, 24 ins. diam., bears S.61°W.,  
42 lks. dist., marked B T.

in accordance with the description in the field notes furnished me. (Destroyed marks of Secs. 34 and 35 on old post.)

For closing cor. to Secs. 35 and 34, I set a Myrtle post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground, marked C C T 22 S R 12 W on N S 35 on E and S 34 on W faces, with 2 notches on E and 4 notches on W faces, from which

A Myrtle, 8 ins. diam., bears N.42°E., 8 lks.  
dist., marked T 22 S R 12 W S 35 B T.

An Alder, 6 ins. diam., bears N.16°W., 36 lks.  
dist., marked T 22 S R 12 W S 34 B T.

A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.36½°E., 55 lks.  
dist., marked T 23 S R 12 W S 3 B T.

Land, mountainous except 5.00 chs.

Soil, rocky, 3rd rate, except 5.00 chs. S of ¼ Sec.  
post which is loam and 1st rate.

Timber, Fir, Cedar, Alder, Maple, Chittenwood.

Undergrowth, Salmon, Salal, Huckle, Thimbleberries,  
Vinemaple.
