

SUBDIVISIONS, T. 22 S., R. 12 W.

CHAINS

on E edges, from which

A Maple, 24 ins. diam., bears N.85°E., 87 lks. dist., marked T.22 S.R.12 W.S.11 B.T.

A Cedar, 36 ins. diam., bears S.65°E., 150 lks. dist., marked T.22 S.R.12 W.S.14 B.T.

in accordance with the description given in the field notes furnished me.

Thence I run

S.89°28'W on true line bet. Secs. 10 and 15.

Va.20°15'E.

Ascend very steeply through Fir and Spruce timber.

On account of steepness of mountain make offset

South 5.00 chs. thence run N.60½°W., 10.00 chs.

8.70 Regain true line.

10.20 Top of ridge, dividing waters flowing into Schofield River, from those into Winchester Bay. +350

13.50 A branch 3 lks. wide, course NW; begin steep ascent. -400

17.40 Top of spur, bears NW and SE; begin descent. +350

21.80 A canyon, course NW, begin ascent. -200

27.40 Top of spur bears NW and SE, begin descent. +250

38.00 A canyon, course N; begin ascent. -300

40.40 Set a Vinemaple post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground, marked ¼ S on N face, from which +40

An Alder, 16 ins. diam., bears N.67½°W., 37 lks. dist., marked ¼ S B T.

A Spruce, 30 ins. diam., bears S.3½°W., 30 lks. dist., marked ¼ S B T.

Keep ascending.

43.50 Top of rise, begin descent. +50

56.50 A branch, course SW; 5 lks. wide. -200

59.25 A branch, 2 lks. wide, course SE; begin ascent.

75.00 Top of spur, bears N and S, begin descent. +150

78.00 A trail, course N and S.
