A Fir, 42 ins. diam., bears S.55*W., 8 lks. dist.
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B.T.

A Fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.87 *E., 49 lks. dist.
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B.T.

Keep ascending.

dist., marked T. 22 S. R.12 W. S. 22 B.T.

A Cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S.15 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 18 lks.
dist., marked T. 22 S. R.12 W. S. 21 B.T.

A Cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears N.56 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 11 lks.
dist., marked T. 22 S. R.12 W. S. 16 B.T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, gravelly; with thin layer of loam on top; 3rd
rate, except about 5 chs. along bottom 1st rate.

Timber, fine Spruce, Fir, Cedar, Hemlock, Alder, Maple.

Undergrowth, Salmonberry, Salal, Huckleberry, Vinemaple.

Andrews house, shown on map, near the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. was
not visible from the line, on account of timber and
brush, but could be seen by stepping out a few rods.
