80.92	Intersect N and S. line 180 lks. south of cor. to Secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23, the post of which being gone, I reestablished the cor. by setting a Cedar post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground, marked: T 22 S. S. 14 on NE. R 12 W. S. 23 on SE. S. 22 on SW. S. 15 on NW., faces with 3 notches on S. and 2 notches on E. edges, also set a marked sandrock 18x10x6 ins, 12 ins. in the ground, from which An Alder, 24 ins. diam., bears N.67*E., 84 lks. dist., marked S. 14 T. 22 S. R. 12 W. B.T. An Alder, 30 ins. diam., bears S.77*E., 60 lks. dist., marked S. 23 T. 22 S. R. 12 W. B.T. An Alder, 24 ins. diam., bears S.68*W., 55 lks. dist., marked S. 22 T. 22 S. R. 12 W. B.T. An Elder, 6 ins. diam., bears N.63*W., 12 lks. dist., marked S. 15 T. 22 S. R. 12 W. B.T. in accordance with the description given in the field notes furnished me. Thence I run S.88*43'W. on true line bet. Secs. 15 and 22. Va. 20*20'E. Ascend E. hillside.	
1.50	Top of spur, bears S.5 *W and N.5*E, begin descent	+75
10.50	A branch, 2 lks. wide, course N.30*E, begin ascent.	-300
19.00	Top of spur, bears S.20*W and N.20*E., begin very steep ascent.	+300
31.00	Along S. slope of ridge.	+300
