

SUBDIVISIONS OF T. 22 S. R. 12 W. W.M.

CHAINS

- 39.80 Trail bears N and S.
- 40.46 On divide, set a fir post 3 ft. long, 5 ins. square, +50  
24 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S.  
on N. face, from which  
A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.19 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*W., 13 lks.  
dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. B.T.  
A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.80 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*W., 12 lks.  
dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. B.T.
- 42.80 Top of spur, bears N and S., begin descent.
- 64.40 Top of second spur, bears N and S. -150
- 67.00 A branch 2 lks. wide, course N. begin ascent. -400
- 70.00 Trail bears N and S.
- 71.75 Top of spur, bears N and S, begin descent. +150
- 75.50 A canyon, course N.10\*E., begin ascent. -250
- 78.90 Top of spur, bears E and W., sharp descent. +100
- 80.92 The cor. to Secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22. -100

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky, covered by a thin layer of loam, 3rd rate.

Timber, fine Fir, Spruce, Cedar, Hemlock, Alder, Maple.

Undergrowth, Salmon and Salalberry, Vinemaple,

Crabapple.

August 13th, 1889.

South bet. Secs. 21 and 22.

Va. 20\*25'E.

Ascend NW hillside.

- 17.00 Dividing ridge between waters flowing into Winchester +250  
Bay and those into the Lakes, bears E and W.,  
begin descent.
- 21.00 A canyon, course SE, begin ascent. -120
- 23.50 Top of spur, bears SE and NW., begin descent. +50
- 27.00 A canyon, course E., begin ascent. -110
- 29.00 Top of spur, bears SE and NW, begin descent. +50
- 34.00 A canyon, course S.20\*W., begin ascent. -80
- 40.00 A Cedar, 10 ins. diam., which I mark  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. on W. face +60
