72.05	Top of divide between waters going into the Lakes and those into Winchester Bay.	+800
81.12	The cor. to Secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28. Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky, covered with a thin layer of loam - 3rd rate. Timber, fine Fir and Spruce, Cedar, Hemlock, Alder, Maple. Undergrowth, Salmon and Salal and Huckleberries. Latitude 43*38'N.,  August 15th, 1889.	
	South, bet. Secs. 27 and 28.  Va. 20*15'E.

4.00	A sag., begin to ascend.	-50
8.50	Top of ridge, bears SW and NW., begin descending	+60
21.00	A very steep descent.	
26.00	A canyon, course SE., begin steep ascent of E. slope.	-300
31.00	Top of ascent, begin descent.	+150
33.00	Foot of descent.	-120
35.10	Coon Creek, 5 lks. wide, course S., begin ascent.	
40.00	Set a Spruce post 3 ft. long, 3 ins, square, 24 ins., in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on W. face, from which An Alder, 24 ins. diam., bears N.58 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 27 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. B.T. An Elder, 6 ins. diam., bears N.60 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 8 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. B.T.	+40
