CHAINS		
49.60	Top of spur, bears E and W., begin descent.	+300
52.00	Enter green timber.	
58.50	A branch 5 lks. wide, course W., begin ascent.	-250
70.25	Top of ridge, bears S.60°E., and N.60°W., begin descent.	+600
80.00	Set a Maple post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. to Secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34, marked T 22 S S 27 on NE., R 12 W S 34 on SE., S 33 on SW., S 28 on NW, faces with 1 notch on S and 3 notches on E edges, from which An Elder, 6 ins. diam., bears N.40°E., 48 lks. dist., marked T 22 S R 12 W S 27 B T. An Elder, 6 ins., diam., bears S.46½°E., 35 lks. dist., marked T 22 S R 12 W S 34 B T. A Maple, 8 ins. diam., bears S.61½°W., 29 lks. dist., marked T 22 S R 12 W S 33 B T. A Cedar, 36 ins. diam., bears N.42°W., 24 lks. dist., marked T 22 S R 12 W S 28 B T. Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky, with a thin layer of loam on top; - 3rd rate. Timber, Spruce, Fir, Cedar, Alder, Maple, Cherry. Undergrowth, Salmon, Salal, Huckleberry, Vinemaple. August 16th, 1889.	
	East on a random line bet. secs. 27 and 34. Va.20°15'E.	
40.00	Set temp. ½ sec. cor.	
80.26	Intersect N and S line 7.40 chs. South of cor. to secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35. Thence I run S.84°43'W. on true line bet, secs. 27 and 34. Va.20°10'E.	
	Descend through burn.	
2.00	Leave burn, enter green timber.	
6.25	A dry branch, course S.	-120
7.50	Trail bears N and S.
