71.75	A canyon, course N., begin steep ascent.	-60
76.00	Top of dividing ridge between the waters flowing into Winchester Bay and those into the Lakes; bears S.80°E and N.80°W., begin descent.	+120
81.73	To cor. of secs. 16, 17, 20 and 21. Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky with a thin top layer of loam, 3rd rate. Timber, fine Spruce, Fir, Cedar, Hemlock, Alder. Undergrowth, Salmon, Salal, Huckleberries, Vinemaple. Aug. 22, 1889.	-80
	West on a random line bet. Secs. 17 and 20. Va. 29°15'E.	
40.00	Set temp. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor.	
80.20	Intersect N. and S. line 310 lks. South of cor, to Secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20; the post being gone, I restore cor. by setting a Spruce post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground, marked T 22 S S 17 on NE, R 12 W S 20 on SE, S 19 on SW face, S 18 on NW faces, with 3 notches on S and 5 notches on E edges, from which A Hemlock, 24 ins. diam., bears N.19°E., 60 lks., dist., marked T 22 S R 12 W S 17 B T. An Alder, 24 ins. diam., bears S.60°E., 10 lks. dist., marked T 22 S R 12 W S 20 B T. A Spruce, 48 ins. diam., bears S.11°W., 154 lks. dist., marked T 22 S R 12 W S 19 B T. An Alder, 24 ins. diam., bears N.59°W., 26 lks. dist., marked T 22 S R 12 W S 18 B T. in accordance with the description given in the field notes furnished me.	
	Thence I run S.87°47'E on true line bet. secs. 17 and 20. Va. 20°50'E.
