	<p>East, on a random line bet. Secs. 21 and 28. Va. 20°15'E.</p>

81.44	Intersect N and S line 182 lks. South of cor. to Secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28.

26.00	Leave bottom; begin to ascend.
