Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky with a thin top layer of loam - 3rd rate.

Timber, fine Spruce, Fir, Cedar, Hemlock, Alder, Maple.

Undergrowth, Salmon, Salal, Huckleberries, Vinemaple.

August 27th, 1889.

East on a random line bet. Secs. 28 and 33.

40.00 Set temp. ¼ sec. cor.

82.12 Intersect N and S line 208 lks. South of cor. to
