82.15	The cor. to Secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33. Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky, with a thin layer of loam, overlying the rock, - 3rd rate. Timber, fine Spruce, Fir, Cedar, Hemlock, Alder. Undergrowth, Salmon, Salal, Huckleberry, Vinemaple.	
	South, bet. Secs. 32 and 33. Va. 20*15'E. Ascend.	
3.00	Top of spur, bears E and W., begin descent.	+ 60
5.25	A gulch, course W., begin ascent.	- 25
9.00	Top of rise on W. slope, begin descent.	+ 50
14.00	Top of dividing ridge, bears S.30*W and N.30*E., begin descent on E. slope, leave green timber, enter burnt timber.	+ 75
24.60	A canyon, course E., begin ascent.	-150
27.75	Top of spur, bears S.30*E and N.30*W, begin descent of SW slope.	+ 90
33.00	A canyon course NE., begin ascent.	-100
37.00	Top of spur, bears E and W. begin descent.	+ 60
40.00	Set a Spruce post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W. face, from which An Alder, 6 ins. diam., bears S.70 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 10 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A Spruce, 18 ins. diam., bears N.78 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 46 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. August 28th, 1889.	
45.20	A canyon, course SE, begin ascent.	-100
46.50	Top of spur, bears SE and NW, begin descent.	+ 40
48.50	A gulch, course E., begin ascent.	- 50
