

## SUBDIVISIONS OF T. 22 S. R 12 W. W.M.

CHAINS

A Hemlock, 7 ins. diam., bears S.45\*E., 8 lks. dist., marked S.4 T 23 S R 12 W B T.

A Hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears S.24\*W., 10 lks. dist., marked S 5 T 23 S R 12 W B T.

An Alder, 12 ins. diam., bears N.17\*W., 35 lks. dist., marked S 32 T 22 S R 12 W B T.

in accordance with the description given in the field notes furnished me.

Adding 64.40 chs. and 6.22 chs. gives 70.62 as length of Sec. line bet. secs. 32 and 33 from cor. of Secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33 to North boundary of township 23 S R 12 W., and adding 10.55 chs. and 4.99 chs. gives 15.54 chs. as distance west of cor. to secs. 4 and 5.

I destroyed marks referring to Sec. 32 on post and bearing trees.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky, with a thin layer of loam on top, - 3rd rate.

Timber, Spruce, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar, Alder.

Undergrowth, Salmon, Salal and Huckleberry.

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West, on true line bet. Secs. 20 and 29.

30.00	Leave same, begin steep descent.	
34.00	A canyon, course SW., continue descent.	-120
