	Va.20°15'E.	
41.00	Intersect 74 lks. North of $\frac{1}{4}$ Section corner termination of old Survey.	
	I found the post and bearing trees standing, viz:	
	An Alder post, 3 ins. sq. about 15 ins. above ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on North face, from which	
	A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.63 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 46 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.	
	A Maple, 18 ins. diam., bears S.27°E., 39 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.	
	I run thence	
	N.81°58'W on True line between Sections 29 and 32.	
	Va.20°15'E.	
	Ascend hill.	
2.50	A spur N and S Descend along SW slope.	
11.50	Stream 5 lks. wide run SE.	
12.00	Ascend steep hill.	
19.00	Spur NW and SE.	+200
	Descend along S. slope.	
25.00	Ravine SE descend steep hill.	
29.00	Ridge N and S.	+300
	Descend.	
33.50	On bare rock.	
35.90	A Fir, 30 ins. diam.	
38.70	Stream 2 lks. wide runs SW	-100
