A Maple, 24 ins. diam., bears N.56 $\frac{1}{2}$ *W., 114 lks. dist., marked T 22 S R 12 W S 32 M C B.T.

A Cedar snag, 20 ins. diam., bears S.26*E., 11 lks. dist., marked T 23 S R 12 W S 5 M C B T.
