General Description

The land in this fractional township is mountainous and densely covered with Fir, Spruce, Hemlock, Cedar and Alder timber. The soil along the lake where the brooks empty are generally first rate, being small bottoms running back along the brooks. The soil on the mountains is good, 2nd rate land and would produce good crops if the timber was removed.

Lake Edna, a small lake in this western part of Section 30 is a beautiful sheet of water being very clear and cold. It is about 40 chs. long and from 10 to 15 chs. wide.

Clear Lake, a portion of which is in Secs. 19 and 30 in this township, is also a fine body of water and is about 80 feet deep. These lakes, as is the case with all the lakes in Townships 22 and 23 S. Ranges 12 and
