

## RETRACEMENTS OF EAST BDY. OF, T. 22 S. R. 12 W. W.M.

CHAINS

Land, mountainous and level.

Soil, gravelly and alluvial 1st and 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Alder, Cedar, Maple, Spruce and Chittem.

Undergrowth, small timber, Chittem, Elder, Vinemaple, Salmonberry and Salal.

May 3rd, 1910.

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Subdivisions of T. 22 S. R. 12 W. W.M.  
Same Deputy and Contract.

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I commence at the cor. of Secs. 25 and 36, which I established in the resurvey of the Subdivision Lines.

Thence I run

East, on a random line, bet. Secs. 25 and 36.

40.00 Set temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

78.98 Intersect E. boundary of the township, 104 lks. S. of the old cor. of Secs. 25 and 36, which is a stone, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

I cut out the markings on this cor. and make an angle point of it as follows:

A sandstone, 20x10x5 ins., 15 ins. in the ground for angle corner, marked A P on face: from which

A Maple, 8 ins. diam., bears S.48\*W., 41 lks. dist., marked A P B T.

A Maple, 10 ins. diam., bears N.43\*W., 29 lks. dist., marked A P B T.

At point of intersection, I set a Fir post, 3 ft. long, 12 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for closing cor. of Secs. 25 and 36, marked

C C T 22 S R 12 W on W.,

S. 36 on S., and

S. 25 on N. face: with 1 groove on S. and 5 grooves on N. face: from which
