

SUBDIVISIONS OF T. 22 S. R. 12 W. W.M.

CHAINS

Thence over bottom land, bears S E, N W.

71.00 Wind River, 10 lks. wide, course N. for 50 lks. thence W.

74.00 Leave bottom land, bears S E, N W.

Ascend N E slope.

74.96 Cedar, 38 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.

Top of ascent 200 ft.

Descend N W slope, 50 ft. to

79.21 The cor. of Secs. 24 and 25.

Land, mountainous and rich bottom land.

Soil, gravelly and alluvial: 1st and 2nd rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar, Maple, Chittem, Dogwood and Myrtle.

Undergrowth, Vinemaple, small timber, Willow, Salmon-berry, Huckleberry, fern and Laurel.

May 6, 1910.

At the cor. of Secs. 13, 14, 23 and 24, established by me.

Thence I run

N.89°51'E., on a random line, bet. Secs. 13 and 24.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor.

81.48 Intersect E boundary of the township 51 lks., N of the angle corner described in the resurvey of E. boundary of the township.

At point of intersection I set a sandstone, 15x12x8 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. of Secs. 13 and 24, marked C C on W., with 3 grooves on N and S faces: from which

A Spruce, 15 ins. diam., bears S.2°W., 26 lks. dist., marked T-22 S R 12 W S 24 B T.

A Maple, 5 ins. diam., bears N.60°30'W., 45 lks. dist., marked T 22 S R 12 W S 13 B T.
