CHAINS

The township is well watered except in the N part of the Township.

The timber in some portions of the township is very heavy but the greater portion is an old burn covered with young hemlock and fir with dense undergrowth of rhododendron, vine-maple and mountain-balm

The township contains a few mines along Sharp's and Martin creek, which are not worked at present time. Mining is carried on extensively E of this township in what is known as the Bohemia mining district

Local attraction is so great in some parts of the township that no dependence can be placed in the needle

RESURVEY

The old cor. of Tps. 23 and 24 S., Rs. 1 W. and 1 E., is a decaying post, marked and witnessed as described in the original field notes, except that the bearing tree in sec. 36 is decayed and fallen.

Alongside the post

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for cor. of Tps. 23 and 24 S., Rs. 1 W. and 1 E., with brass cap marked
