- 40.50 A dry creek bed, 5 lks. wide, course SW., ascend about 175 ft. to
- 65.00 Top of spur, course SW. and descend about 150 ft.
- 79.75 The old sec. cor., a post bears south, 100 lks. dist. I destroyed this post, also the marks on old bearing trees.
- 80.00 Set a post, 4 ft. long and 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground for cor. to secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, marked T 23 S S 36 on NE., R 2 W S 1 on SE., T 24 S ^S _^ 2 on SW. and S 35 on NW., faces with 1 notch on E. and 5 notches on W. edges., from which,
- A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.53*E., 21 lks. dist., marked T 23 S R 2 W S 36 B T.
- A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.49*E., 57 lks. dist. marked T 24 S R 2 W S 1 B T.
- A Fir, 48 ins. diam., bears S.25*W., 32 lks. dist. marked T 24 S R 2 W S 2 B T
- A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.28*W., 29 lks. dist., marked T 23 S R 2 W S 35 B T.
- Land, mountainous and heavily timbered with Fir. and Hemlock.
- Dense undergrowth of Vine-maple and Rhododendron.
- Soil, sandy and rocky, 3rd and 4th rate.
- 80.00 chains
August 5th 1894.
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- West, bet. secs. 2 and 35
- Va. 20*E.
- Through heavy timber, descend about 300 ft.
- 0.20 A Fir, 40 ins. in diam.
- 6.50 Enter prairie, known as Elk Meadows, course N. and S.
- 13.00 Leave prairie and enter timber, course N. and S.
- 39.00 Old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., a post bears South 4.00 chains. I destroyed this post, also the old bearing trees.
- 40.00 Set a post, 3 ft. long and 3 ins. square, 24 ins. in
