

## Southern Boundary of T. 23 S., R. 2 W., W.M.

## CHAINS

West on a true line bet. sec. 6 and 31.

Va. 18°30'E.

Through heavy timber, ascend about 100 ft.

0.50 Old sec. cor., a post bears south 3.40 chs. dist.

I destroyed this post, also the marks on the old bearing trees.

5.00 Top of ridge, course SW. and descend about 250 ft.

18.00 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course SW.

22.00 Creek, 15 lks. wide, course SW. and ascend about 100 ft.

27.00 Top of spur, course SW. and descend about 150 ft.

33.00 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course SW.

39.60 Old  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., a post bears south 3.00 chs. dist.

I destroyed this post and the marking on old bearing trees.

40.00 Set a post, 3 ft. long and 3 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. on N. face, from which,

A Hemlock, 7 ins. diam., bears S.30°W., 13 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.

A Vine-maple, 6 ins. diam., bears N.66°W., 33 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.

53.00 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course SW. and ascend about 150 ft. to,

68.15 Intersect the east boundary of T 23 S R 3 W at a point 10.75 chains North of
