General Description

This township is mostly high and mountainous- The summit of the Calipocia mountains runs down the W. boundary to about the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bet. secs. 30 & 31 then trends E. about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from S. boundary passing S. of $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. on E. bdy. of Sec. 25 -

The Coast Fork River has a bottom from 20 to 60 rods wide all the way through the Tp. which is very rich. Garroute Creek also has some very rich bottom land which is settled two ranches above the old survey also two claims taken on the main river.

The timber is abundant and of the best quality of red & yellow fir, smooth bark cedar, hemlock, yew & maple & cherry. Also vine maple, laurel & rhododendron underbrush.

The soil is very rich on the creek bottoms and much of it 1st rate on mountain sides & benches
