	<p>I make a diligent search for the "established" SE cor. of sec. 34, but fail to find any trace thereof.</p> <p>Therefore, I begin at the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on the S bdy. of sec. 34; the post, and bearing tree described by the surveyor general as a fir, 4 ins. diam., bearing S.83*W., 33 lks. dist., are entirely destroyed. I re-establish this $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. from the bearing tree on the N., as follows:</p> <p>Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N face; from which</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.42*W., 64 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N.5*W., 18 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T</p> <p>Mag. decl. 19*30'E From this $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. I run N.89*58'E., on a true line, on the S. bdy. of sec. 34</p> <p>Ascend spur</p>
15.75	Top of spur, sloping NW, 175 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. desc.
25.75	Ravine, sloping N, 50 ft. below top of spur; ascend spur
28.50	Spur, sloping N., 75 ft. above ravine; continue ascent on N. slope of spur.
35.00	Top of spur, sloping S.80*W., 50 ft. above spur last noted; thence along hillside, sloping S
40.00	<p>I again make diligent search for the cor. of secs. 34, 35 2 and 3, but find no sign or indication of the corner or its accessories.</p> <p>Set a sand stone, 12x8x8 ins. 8 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 34, 35, 2 and 3 marked with 4 notches on W and 2 notches, on the E edges; from which</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.32*E., 86 lks. dist. Marked T 24 S R 4 W S 2 B T</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.81*W., 79 lks. dist. Marked T 24 S B 4 W S 3 B T</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A madrona, 8 ins. diam., bears N.64*W., 36 lks. dist.</p>
