Set a hemlock post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in ground, for a closing cor. of secs. 25 and 36, marked on W C C T 23 S R 4 W¹, S 25 on N, and S 36 on S faces, with 1 groove on S, and 5 grooves on N faces, from which A yew, 12 ins. diam., bears S.30*W., 32 lks. dist. Marked T 23 S R 4 W S 36 B T A hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears N.45*W., 13 lks. dist. Marked T 23 S R 4 W S 25 B T</p>
	<p>Thence I run W on a true line, bet. secs. 25 and 36; descend</p>
2.59	<p>Creek, 3 lks. wide, course N., 20 ft. below closing corner; Ascend spur</p>
6.80	<p>Top of spur, slopes N.75 ft. above creek last noted; descend</p>
18.66	<p>Creek, 5 lks. wide, course N. 150 ft. below last spur Ascend spur</p>
28.60	<p>Top of spur, slopes N 100 ft. above creek descend into ravine.</p>
31.25	<p>Ravine, course N., 25 ft. below top of spur; ascend spur</p>
36.10	<p>Top of spur, slopes N., 25 ft. above ravine; descend</p>
38.34	<p>Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N., 25 ft. below top of spur; ascend</p>
40.84	<p>To the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bet. secs. 25 and 36 Land, mountainous Soil, 2nd and 3rd rates Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, yew, maple, alder, dogwood, and madrona Dense undergrowth of hemlock, vine-maple, fir, rhododendron, and mountain-balm.</p>
