59.25	Begin to descend W slope of hill. The point before noted as summit of Mt. Yoncalla, bears N.7½*W.	
80.00	Set post, cor. to secs. 5 and 6, from which A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears S.3*W., 46 lks. A Y. oak, 7 ins. diam., bears S.32½*E., 61 lks. This mile runs on a ridge of high broken hills. Timber, fir, oak, laurel, vine maple, etc. Undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, fern, etc. Soil, 3d rate. April 27, 1853.	-250
	West, on North boundary of Sec. 6. Va.18*30'E.	
1.25	A ravine, course N.	-60
25.50	Top of spur, NW and SE.	+80
33.07	A yellow oak, 18 ins. diam.	-75
34.50	Leave timber and enter prairie NE and SW.	-25
40.00	Set ¼ sec. post, from which A Y. oak, 16 ins. diam., bears S.89½*E., 587 lks. A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.22-3/4*W., 1074 lks. Va.18*25'E.	-60
43.50	Foot of hill and enter valley, NW and SE.	-100
58.50	A stream, 8 lks. wide, course NW. Leave prairie and enter timber, NW and SE.	
62.86	A fir, 18 ins. diam.	
68.20	A fir, 36 ins. diam.	
72.50	A stream, 30 lks. wide, course NE. Current, deep and rapid.
