Cor. to secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22 is in the river. I find that my compass stands due West of the flag, which I set 75 lks. West of the cor. to fractional secs. 15 and 22. To ascertain the distance across the river I measure South 1.84 chs. From this point the flag bears N.74 3/4* E. which gives for distance across the river to flag 6.75 chs. dist., to which add the distance from flag to post .75 chs. of 7.50 chs. width of river.

Therefore the cor. to secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22 is in the river 37.60 chs. North of cor. to fractional secs. 21 and 22 on left bank and 3.00 chs. West of the cor. to fractional secs. 15 & 22 and 4.50 chs. East of the temporary post and the line between secs. 15 and 22 is 80.50 chs. Namely 77.50 chs. East of river and 3.00 chs. in the river.

Land broken and 3rd rate. Timber fir and myrtle.

North between secs. 15 and 16 .

Va. 19*30'E.

As the cor. to secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22 is in the Umpqua river, I commence at cor. to fractional secs. 15 and 22 on right bank of river. It being 3.00 chs. East of sec cor., I run North 7.50 chs., thence West 3.00 chs. to a point on line between secs. 15 and 16.
