

## County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

West Boundary of T. 23 S., R. 8 W., W. M.

CHAINS	Descend.
80.00	Foot of descent, a point about 200 ft. below top of ridge. Enter creek bottom, course NE & SW. Set a post 4 ft. long and 4 ins. sq., 2 ft. in the ground for cor. to sec. 7 & 18, marked S 7 on N, S 18 on S, T 23 S R 8 W on E faces with 2 notches on N and 4 notches on S sides, from which, A white fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.27*E., 88 lks. dist., marked T 23 S R 8 W S 7 B T. A white fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.65*E., 7 lks. dist., marked T 23 S R 8 W S 18 B T. A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.57*W., 37 lks. dist., marked T 23 S R 8 W S 7 & 18 B T. Land 80.00 chs. mountainous. Soil 3rd & 4th rate. Heavily timbered fir, cedar, hemlock and maple. Dense undergrowth of salmonberry, sallow, thimbleberry and briars 80.00 chains. April 10, 1894.
	North on a true line on W boundary of sec. 7. Va. 20*20'E.
	Over level bottom.
6.70	Little Camp creek 25 lks. wide, course NW from NE.
7.85	Trail from Elkton to Smith's Ranch, course SW.
8.60	Camp Creek, 50 lks. wide, course N from SW.
11.40	Leave creek, course NW.
	Ascend.
13.37	A fir, 24 ins. diam., marked with 2 notches on N & S sides.
14.61	The cor. to secs. 12 & 13, T. 23 S., R. 9 W. I obliterate marks on E of old cor.
40.00	Set a post 3 ft. long and 3 ins. sq., 2 ft. in ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on West face, from which, A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.62*W., 25 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
