

Subdivisions of T. 23 S., R. 8 W., W. M.

CHAINS

Secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, which is a post, 4 ins. sq.,
marked

T 23 S S 18 on NE

R 7 W S 19 on SE

R 8 W S 24 on SW and

S 13 on NW faces, with 3 notches on N & S edges

from which

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.27*W., 30 lks. dist.,
marked T 23 S R 8 W S 24 B T.

The other bearing trees being gone, I marked new ones as
follows:

A fir, 4 ins. diam., bears N.38*E., 73 lks. dist.,
marked T 23 S R 7 W S 18 B T.

A maple, 18 ins. diam., bears S.29*E., 79 lks. dist.,
marked T 23 S R 7 W S 19 B T.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.42*W., 122 lks. dist.,
marked T 23 S R 8 W S 13 B T.

Thence I run

S.89*30'W., on a true line, bet. secs. 13 and 24.

Va.20*33'E.

In creek bottom through timber.

1.40 Mehl Creek, 25 lks. wide, course North and enter clearing.

6.50 Leave clearing and ascend.

19.50 Top of a spur on S slope.

25.00 Stream, 3 lks. wide, course S.

Line bet. secs. 13 and 24, I destroy $\frac{1}{2}$ secs. cor., and at
40.72 which is in middle of Sec. line, I mark a leaning laurel,

16 ins. diam., with (+) at exact point and $\frac{1}{4}$ S from which

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.16*W., 14 lks. dist.,
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.64*W., 50 lks. dist.,
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
