	Thence I run, N.89°59'W., on a true line between secs. 26 & 35.  Va. 20°30'E.  Over bench through timber.
3.50	Ascend.
9.50	Top of mountain, course N W and south about 100 ft. above cor. & descend.
30.00	Top of a spur on S slope.
40.12	Set a post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N face from which A white fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N.10°W., 14 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A white fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.17 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 27 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
48.70	Stream 4 lks. wide, course S.
53.00	Stream 10 lks. wide, course S E.
59.00	Same stream 10 lks. wide, course N E from W.
65.30	Leave same from N W.
67.00	Same stream 10 lks. wide, course N E.
68.00	Same stream 10 lks. wide, course S E.
80.23	T. cor. to secs. 26, 27, 34, & 35. Land mountainous 80.23 chs. Soil 3rd & 4th rate. Heavily timbered with fir, cedar and maple. Dense undergrowth of salmonberry, vine maple and hazel.  April 24th, 1894.
	N.0°2'W., between secs. 26 & 27.  Va. 20°35'E.  Descend through timber.
1.00	Stream 10 lks. wide, course E. and ascend.
19.50	Top of a ridge, course E & W., about 500 ft., above stream and descend.
28.00	Stream 1 lk. wide, course N E. A point about 200 ft. below top of ridge and ascend.
30.50	Top of a spur, course E. & descend.
