CHAINS

Descend Abruptly.

A point about 250 ft. below top of mountain. Set a post 4 ft. long, and 4 ins. sq., for corner to sec. 2, 3, 10, & 11., marked

T 23 S S 2 on N.E.

R 8 W S 11 on S E.

S 10 on S W.

S 3 on N W faces with 5 notches on S and 2 notches on E edges from which,

A white fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.32°E., 75 lks. dist., marked T 23 S R 8 W S 2 B T.

A maple, 6 ins. diam., bears S.75°E., 41 lks. dist., marked T 23 S R 8 W S 11 B T.

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S.55°W., 68 lks. dist., marked T 23 S R 8 W S 10 B T.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N.68°W., 22 lks. dist., marked T 23 S R 8 W S 3 B T.

Land mountainous 80.00 chs. Soil 3rd & 4th rate. Heavily timbered with fir, cedar, & maple. Undergrowth of Hazel salmonberry, raspberry and briars.

I begin at the witness cor. between secs. 2 & 11 which is a fir 30 ins. diam., marked

S 2 on N

T 23 S R 8 W on E

S 11 on S and

W C on W. sides from which

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.40°W., 17 lks. dist., marked T 23 S R 8 W S 2 W C B T.

No other bearing tree standing.

Thence I run, N.89°40'W., on a true line between secs. 2 & 11.
