60.30	Top of a spur, course S E., about 300 ft., high. Descend.
67.50	Gulch, course S E., ascend.
78.50	The top of mountain, course N E., and S W., about 600 ft. above last sec. corner.
80.26	The cor. to sec. 16, 17, 20 & 21. Land mountainous. 80.26 chs. Soil 3rd & 4th rate. Heavily timbered with fir, cedar and hemlock. Dense undergrowth of hazel, sallow, arrowwood and briars. May 11th, 1894.

13.80	Stream 2 lks. wide, course N W., A point about 400 ft. below Sec. corner.

40.00	Set a post 3 ft. long and 3 ins. sq., 2 ft. in the ground, marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S on W. face, from which, A laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears N.46°W., 9 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T. A laurel, 6 ins. diam. bears N.81°E., 15 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.
42.08	A fir, 60 ins. diam., marked with 2 notches on N & S. sides.
47.50	Top of ridge, course E & W., about 400 ft. above stream.
57.85	Stream 3 lks wide, course N W., about 400 ft. below top of last ridge.
68.50	Stream 1 lk. wide, course S W.
