A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.5*W., 8 lks. dist.

marked T 23 S R 9 W S 34 B T.

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.68*W., 43 lks. dist.,

marked T 23 S R 9 W S 27 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, gravelly; 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Cedar, Hemlock, Alder, Chinquapin.

Underbrush, dense, small firs, greasewood, huckleberries.

Mountainous and heavily timbered land and land covered

by a dense overgrowth.

80.00 chains.

W. bet. secs. 27 and 34.

Continue a gradual ascent of E. slope of mountains,
heavily timbered with Fir, Hemlock, Alder, Vine-maple,
Mountain Laurel and Huckleberries.

40.00 Set a Hemlock post, 3 ft long, 3 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the
ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor; marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 27 on N. face, 34 on S.
face, from which,

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N. 53*W., 25 lks. dist.,
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 27 B T.

A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S 32 W, 27 lks., dist.
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 34 B T.

Clouds obscured the sky and did not allow an observation
for lat. at noon. Continue ascending.

50.00 The ascent becomes more abrupt; still an E. slope of
mountain.

53.00 D.W. Owens trail to Lake Creek, bears N. and S.

58.00 Top of dividing ridge, bears SW. and NE., 150 ft. above
 $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.; begin a gradual descent of NW. slope of
mountain.

80.00 I set a hemlock post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in
ground for cor. of secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34, marked
T 23 S S 27 on NE.; R 9 W S 34 on SE.
S 33 on SW.; and S 28 on NW. faces with 1 notch on S.
and 3 notches on E. edges, from which,
