## CHAINS

I destroyed all marks on former cor. referring to secs.  
28 and 33.

August, 30: At this sec. cor., I set off  $8^{\circ}48'N.$  on the  
decl. arc; and at  $0^{\text{h}}5^{\text{m}}$  P.M., l.m.t. observe the sun  
on the meridian; the resulting lat. is  $43^{\circ}32'$ .

Thence I run

East on a true line bet. secs. 28 and 33.

Descend mountain spur, heavily timbered.

2.50 A stream, 2 lks. wide, course SW., begin to ascend a  
spur.

19.50 Top of spur, bears N. and S., begin to descend.

31.20 A stream, 1 lk. wide, course SW., 80 ft. below top of spur.

August 30: At  $3^{\text{h}}$  P.M., l.m.t., I set off  $43^{\circ}32'$  on the  
lat. arc;  $8^{\circ}55.5'N.$ , on the decl. arc, and determine  
a true meridian with the solar at this point.

Begin to ascend.

39.80 Set a Dogwood post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq, 24 ins. in  
the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 28 on N. face  
and 33 on S. face, from which,

A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears  $N.15^{\circ}E.$ , 47 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 28 B T.

A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears  $S.69^{\circ}W.$ , 27 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 33 B T.

Continue to ascend.

51.00 The ascent of SW. slope of mountain becomes steeper;  
enter second growth fir timber, bears N. and S.

63.00 Ascent moderates; leave second growth firs, enter a  
heavy growth of mountain Laurels.

70.60 A Fir, 50 ins. diam., on line; I mark with 2 notches on  
E. and W. sides.

79.60 The cor. of secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34.

Land, mountainous

Soil, gravelly, 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar, Alder, Chittewood.

Undergrowth of Huckleberries, Salalberries, Vine-maple.

Mountainous and heavily timbered land.
