CHAINS	Enter dense undergrowth of small hemlocks, alders, hazel, and huckleberries.
46.00	Top of ridge, bears NE. and SW.; begin a steep descent.
53.25	A bluff of rocks, 40 ft. high, bears N. and S.
53.75	A stream, 3 lks. wide, course N. begin to ascend E. slope of mountain.
60.00	Change to ascent of N. slope.
79.70	The cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26 and 27
	Land, mountainous.
	Soil, gravelly, 3rd rate.
	Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder.
	Dense undergrowth of small hemlock, alders, hazel and huckleberries.
	Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth.

N.0²W. bet. secs. 22 and 23.

Descend sharply N. slope of mountain, covered heavily with timber.

5.50	Bottom of dry gulch, course NE., along E. slope of ridge.
12.00	Dry gulch, course SE., begin a very steep ascent.
24.50	Top of spur, bears SE. and NW., 200 ft. above gulch. Follow along the E. side of dividing ridge.
39.50	Top of dividing ridge, bears NE. and SW.
40.00	Set a sandstone, 16 x 12 x 6 ins., 11 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face, raised a mound of stone around it; from which, A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.10*E., 14 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 23 B T. A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.21*W., 14 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 22 B T.
