- 1.25 Top of ridge bears NW. and SE., begin to descend.
- 10.55 A stream, 1 lk. wide, course S., begin ascent.
- 22.00 A stream, 2 lks. wide, course SE., continue ascent.
- 38.50 Top of ridge, bears NW. and SE., 250 ft. above stream;  
begin to descend a S. slope.
- 39.75 Set a hemlock post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in  
ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 14 on N. face and  
23 on S. face, from which,  
A Maple, 10 ins. diam., bears S.40\*E., 8 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 23 B T.  
A Cedar, 16 ins. diam., bears N.69 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*W., 45 lks. dist.  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 14 B T.
- Continue to descend.
- 45.00 Foot of descent; begin to ascend.
- 51.00 Top of spur, bears NE. and SW., begin a very steep descent  
of NW. slope.
- 63.25 A dry gulch, course N., continue descending.
- 70.10 A stream, 1 lk. wide, course N., 250 ft. below top of  
spur; begin a steep ascent of E. slope.
- 79.50 The cor. of secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23.  
Land, mountainous.  
Soil, gravelly; 3rd rate.  
Timber, fir, hemlock cedar, maple, alder.  
Undergrowth, dense, of huckleberries, vine- maple, arrow-  
wood.  
Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered by  
dense undergrowth.
