CHAINS	
14.50	Summit of mountain, bears NE. and SW., 120 ft above sec. cor., begin descent of SE. slope.
17.00	Dickenson Trail to Loon Lake, bears NE. and SW.
33.85	A stream, 3 lks. wide, course E. begin ascent.
40.10	Set a hemlock post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. 10 on W. face, 11 on E. face, from which, A Fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.15*E., 28 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 11 B T. A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.71*W., 20 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 10 B T. Keep on ascending.
48.00	Top of spur, bears E. and W., 100 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. begin to descend, sharply.
63.75	A stream, 2 lks. wide, course NE. begin ascent.
71.00	Top of spur, bears E. and W., gradually descending E. slope to
80.10	The cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15. Land, mountainous. Soil, gravelly and 3rd rate. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, maple, Dense undergrowth of small hemlocks, vine-maple and hazel Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered by a dense undergrowth. 80.10 chs. September 26, 1898.
	Cor. of secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34. S.0*2'E. on a random line bet. secs. 33 and 34.
40.00	Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
81.42	Intersect S. bdy of tp., 9 lks. W. of cor. of secs. 33 and 34; described on page 9 of the Exterior lines; thence I run N.0*6'W. on true line bet. secs. 33 and 34. Descend mountain slope, covered heavily with timber.
3.40	A stream 3 lks. wide, course S.E.; begin ascent.
16.40	Foot of bluffs, bearing E. & W. ascend over them.
