CHAINS

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, alder.

Dense undergrowth of huckleberries and salmon berries.

Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered
by a dense undergrowth.

80.10 chs.

May 24, 1899

N.0*2'W. on a random line bet. secs. 15 and 16.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

116.62 Intersect E. and W. line, 72 lks. E. of cor. of secs.,
9,10,15 and 16.,

Ascend mountain slope, covered heavily with timber.

7.40 Top of spur, bears NE. and SW., continue ascent of a
NE. slope.

15.60 Top of ridge, bears E. and W., 150 ft. above cor.,
begin a steep descent of S. slope.

34.10 The descent becomes more gradual

63.80 A stream, 8 lks. wide, course NW, 500 ft. below top of
ridge, begin ascent.

76.62 A point, 150 ft. above stream, I set a hemlock post
3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for
 $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 16 on W. face, 15 on E. face
from which,

A Hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears N.83*E., 19 lks. dist.
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 15 B T.

A Hemlock, 24 ins. diam., bears N.10*W., 54 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 16 B T.

Continue to ascend.

84.90 Dickenson Trail to Loon Lake, bears E. and W.

86.20 Summit of mountain ridge, bears E. and W., 250 ft. above
 $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., begin to descend S. slope

114.20 A stream, 8 lks. wide, course SW., 400 ft. below summit
of ridge, begin ascent.
