CHAINS	Continue to ascend a very steep ascent of N. slope.
82.50	Change to ascent of NW. slope on a bench.
108.40	Top of ridge, bears E. and W., 175 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. Dickenson Trail to Loon Lake, bears E and W. on top of ridge; begin to descend S. slope
120.52	The cor. of secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22. Land, mountainous Soil, gravelly; 3rd rate. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, alder Undergrowth of huckle and salmonberries. Mountainous or heavily timbered land, 120.52 chs. June 2nd, 1899
	NO*3'W. on random line bet. secs. 8 and 9
40.00	Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
79.70	Intersect E. and W. line, 46 lks. E. of cor. of secs., 4, 5, 8 and 9, whence I run, S.0*23'E. on true line bet. secs. 8 and 9. Descend, slightly, mountain covered heavily with timber
2.00	A stream, 10 lks. wide, course NE.
4.00	Same stream, 10 lks. wide, course NW.
22.70	Same stream, 10 lks. wide, course NE., begin ascent of N. slope of mountain.
39.72	Set a sandstone 12 x 10 x 10 ins., 8 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, from which, A Hemlock, 5 ins. diam., bears S.80*E., 17 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 9 B T. A Hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears S.11*W., 30 lks., dist marked, $\frac{1}{4}$ S 8 B T. Continue ascent.
44.75	Enter burned timber, bears E. and W., continue ascent of N. slope of mountain covered heavily with timber.
