

Retracement of the South Bdy. of Sec. 34, T. 23 S., R. 10 W.

Branch, 3 lks. wide, course S.

My line falls 128 lks. S. of the C. C. of secs. 2 and 3, which is a post, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

This portion of the line therefore bears N.87*36'E., and the distance is 33.07 chs.

Thence from the C. C., I run

N.89*49'E., on a blank line along the S. bdy. of sec. 34 and at

My line falls 50 lks. S. of the cor. of secs. 34 and 35, T. 23 S., R. 10 W., which is a post, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General

The bearing of this portion of the line is therefore N.86*04'E. and the dist. is 7.62 chs.

Set a cedar post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35, marked T 23 S S 26 on NE., R 10 W S 35 on SE., S 34 on SW., and S 27 on NW face, with 1 notch on S., and 2 notches on E. edge; witnessed as described by the Surveyor Gen.

At the cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35

Thence I run

West on sectional correction line, bet. secs. 27 and 34 Over mountainous land through heavy timber and dense undergrowth
