CHAINS 61.75  71.50  80.00	<p>Branch, 1 lk. wide; course S.75*E.</p> <p>Same branch; course NE.</p> <p>The cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16</p> <p>Land, mountainous</p> <p>Soil, 1st 50.00 chs., 2nd rate, remainder, rocky; 4th rate</p> <p>Timber, fir</p> <p>Undergrowth, small fir, vine-maple and elder</p> <p>Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 80.00 chs.</p>
1.52	<p>The post set for the cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15 being much decayed, I destroy, and at the same point, Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for the cor. of secs. 11 and 14, marked T 23 S S 11 on NE., R 10 W S 14 on SE., S 15 on SW., and S 15 on NW. face, with 4 notches on S., and 2 notches on E. edge.</p> <p>I obliterate all marks upon the bearing trees referring to secs. 10 and 15.</p> <p>In place of B.T. in sec. 14, only the stump of which remains I mark the following:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S.11<math>\frac{1}{2}</math>*E., 75 lks. dist.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">Marked T 23 S R 10 W S 14 B T</p> <p>Thence I run</p> <p>North, on a true line bet. secs. 11 and 15</p> <p>On bare mountainside</p> <p>Intersect the S. bdy. of sec. 10, and</p> <p>Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 11 and 15, marked T 23 S S 11 on SE., R 10 W S 15 on SW. face, with 4 notches on S., and 2 notches on E. edge; from which</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.9*E., 85 lks. dist.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">Marked T 23 S R 10 W S 11 B T</p>
