1.60	Branch, 1 lk. wide; course, SE.
15.20	Descend steep mountain.
17.20	Branch, 1 lk. wide, 100 ft. below sec. cor., course SE. July 28, 1906.
28.00	Branch, 1 lk. wide, course SE.
34.81	Set a fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on N. bdy. of sec. 11, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N and 11 on S face, from which An alder, 8 ins. diam., bears S.88°W., 7 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 11 B T. An alder, 8 ins. diam., bears N.19°W., 15 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
