

Subdivisions of T. 23 S., R. 10 W.

CHAINS 84.00	Summit of divide bet. Coos River and Loon Lake, 800 ft. above creek. Descend.
80.14	The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10. Land, mountainous. Soil, 3rd and 4th rate. Timber, fir, mostly second growth. Undergrowth, small fir, alder, salal, vinemaple, thimbleberry and huckleberry. Land, mountainous or covered with dense undergrowth, 80.14 chs. <p style="text-align: right;">August 16, 1906.</p>
	At the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10. Thence I run N.0°2'W., on a true line bet. secs. 3 and 4. Ascend over rough mountainous land through an old burn.
4.35	Summit of ridge, 150 ft. above sec. cor., bears E and W.
14.50	Head of gulch, 300 ft. below ridge, course NW and ascend.
18.00	Summit of spur on steep mountainside, 25 ft. above gulch, course NW.
22.00	Head of gulch, course N.70°W.
26.50	Top of spur, 50 ft. above gulch, sloping W., descend 150 ft.
33.80	Branch, 1 lk. wide, course W and ascend.
40.00	Set a sandstone, 30x12x6 ins., 23 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{2}$ on W face, from which A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.80°E., 19 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S 3 B T. A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.36°W., 7 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S 4 B T.
48.25	Summit of spur, sloping W in thicket of manzanita and rhododendron, 400 ft. above branch. Descend.
65.20	Branch, 1 lk. wide, 350 ft. below summit of spur, course W
