

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Resurvey and Retracement of Subdivisional Lines of T. 23 S., R. 10 W. as surveyed by Levi C. Walker Deputy Surveyor under special instructions dated August 23, 1905 independent of, but in connection with his Contract No. 763 dated June 20, 1905.

CHAINS

Retracement of the line bet. secs. 34 and 35, T. 23 S., R. 10 W. At the cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35.

Thence I run

South on a blank line bet. secs. 34 and 35.

Over mountainous land through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

8.62 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course NW., and ascend 200 ft.

25.00 Summit of divide, bears E and W and descend.

39.07 My line falls 2.12 chs. W of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. which is a cedar post, 4 ins. sq., firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

The true bearing of this line is therefore S.3*6'E., and the distance is 39.12 chs.

Thence, from the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., I run

South on a blank line bet. secs. 34 and 35.

10.70 A creek, 8 lks. wide, 350 ft. below divide, course W.

23.30 Recross the same creek, course SE and ascend 200 ft.

40.04 Intersect the S bdy. of the Tp. at the cor. of secs. 34 and 35 heretofore described.

The true bearing of this line is therefore South.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 3rd rate.

Timber, fir and hemlock.

Undergrowth, vine maple, salal, fir and hemlock.

Land, mountainous, heavily timbered or covered with dense undergrowth, 79.16 chs.

May 10, 1906.

Resurvey of the line bet. secs. 26 and 27, T. 23 S., R. 10 W.

At the cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35.

Thence I run

North on a blank line bet. secs. 26 and 27.
